PAR 305.23 GUR	Gurian, Michael. A fine young man : what parents, mentors, and educators can do to shape adolescent boys into exceptional men. New York : J.P. Tarcher/Putnam, 1999, c1998. Discusses the different strategies that can be used to help boys ages ten to twenty learn how to respect others and overcome the obstacles they often encounter during those years.
PAR 306.874 WOL	Wolf, Anthony E. "Get out of my life, but first could you drive me and Cheryl to the mall?" : a parent's guide to the new teenager. New York : Farrar, Straus and Giroux, 2002. Presents advice on raising adolescents, covering communication, trust, control, conflict, and such issues as divorce, school, the Internet, sex, drugs and drinking, and suicide.
PAR 306.874 COH	Cohen-Sandler, Roni. I'm not mad, I just hate you! : a new understanding of mother-daughter conflict. New York : Penguin Books, 1999. Explains how mother-daughter friction during adolescence can empower girls and teach them valuable skills that can be used later in life.

Describes an education program which has produced significant, lasting improvements in the school districts where it has already been implemented, demonstrating how a school's educational performance may be most directly affected by how the school is managed.

Explains a variety of strategies parents can use to improve their relationships with their children and improve how they communicate and relate with their teens.
- PAR 646.7 RIE            Riera, Michael. Surviving high school. Berkeley, CA : Celestial Arts, c1997. A guide to getting through high school by finding solutions to the unique problems teenager face, and includes commentaries by students, questions to think about, and additional readings.
