Study Week is the week before final exams each semester. The intent of "Study Week" is to allow students and staff quality time without interruptions to focus on activities that promote review/study necessary for adequate student preparation for finals.

The following things are **prohibited** during Study Week:

1. Fieldtrips
2. Shadowing
3. After school/lunch activities – such as clubs, dances, BOSA, special events.
4. Passes sent to classes to pull out students from class for any reason
5. New student projects that have nothing to do with **final assessment**.
6. NOTE: Athletic games are an exception. Students should not be penalized for missing practice to study.
7. Giving final examinations to students-exception: 12th graders will take **English/Government/Economics finals**

The following kinds of activities are **encouraged**:

1. Homework
2. Activities that encourage preparation for finals including review tests or projects that are used as the semester final assessment.
3. After school tutoring or review sessions.
