





Each year, Silicon Valley Community Foundation's diverse scholarships help students of all academic levels, from the highest achieving students to those just beginning to show academic promise. In partnership with our donors, SVCF has awarded more than \$11.2 million in scholarships since 2007.

General Scholarship Timeline

December

Scholarship season begins. Eligibility requirements and application instructions released.

January – February

Complete and submit the financial aid application that applies to you. Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) website: fafsa.ed.gov or California Dream Act Application website: dream.csac.ca.gov

Applications for **SVCF Managed Scholarships** (listed on pages 6-13 in this brochure) will be accepted online starting Wednesday, January 6, 2016. View full application details at siliconvalleycf.org/scholarships. Remember to:

- 1. Thoroughly review the scholarship descriptions and application instructions online, and bookmark or print the pages so that you can reference the information throughout the application process.
- 2. Create an applySVCF account if you are a new applicant. Complete the online application and upload all required attachments.
- 3. Review and submit your online application.

Application periods vary for **Donor Involved Scholarships** (listed on pages 14-19 in this brochure). Review the scholarship descriptions in this brochure and online at siliconvalleycf.org/scholarships. To apply, contact the appropriate organization or individual listed.

February - May

The application deadline for most SVCF Managed Scholarships is in late February. Deadlines vary for Donor Involved Scholarships.

Submitted applications will be screened for completeness and eligibility. Selection Committees review applications.

March - April

Finalists are identified and interviews are conducted (for select programs only).

Mid-April/Early May

Invitations to interview will be emailed to finalists. Please ensure the scholarship program you've applied to has your correct contact information.

May - June

Student notifications are sent. Notifications are mailed and emailed, so please ensure the scholarship program you've applied to has your correct contact information. Should you be selected, you will receive a letter detailing your award information and requirements for claiming your scholarship.

July - December

Scholarship payments are disbursed to schools.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is a scholarship fund?

Scholarship funds are charitable accounts established at SVCF by generous individuals, corporations or organizations for the purpose of assisting students in paying for their education. Some funds are specific to residents of a city or county, while others are directed to students interested in a specific field of study. Scholarships do not need to be repaid.

What is the difference between SVCF Managed Scholarship Funds and Donor Involved Scholarship Funds? How do I apply?

SVCF staff administers the application, selection and award process of SVCF Managed Scholarship Funds. Applications are accepted online through SVCF's website. Visit **siliconvalleycf.org/scholarships/community-foundation-managed** for complete details.

While SVCF provides oversight and administers the payment process for Donor Involved Scholarship Funds, the application and selection processes are managed by an external selection committee appointed by SVCF. For an application, or additional information, contact the appropriate organization or individual listed in the scholarship descriptions in this brochure or online at **siliconvalleycf.org/scholarships/donor-involved**.

How are eligibility requirements determined?

Scholarships are available through SVCF, thanks to the generosity of donors who have established scholarship funds with us. Each donor determines the eligibility criteria for their scholarship. Although all scholarships consider financial need, some scholarships also focus on academic achievement, academic potential and/or community service. Please read the specific requirements for each scholarship (listed in this brochure and online) to determine if you are eligible.

Are only graduating high school seniors eligible?

No. While many of our scholarships are for graduating high school seniors, others are open to students already enrolled in college or adults who want to go back to school.

What if I am not a "straight A" student?

SVCF offers scholarships for a variety of students, including part-time students and students who are likely not to receive other scholarships because of their grades. Read all scholarship descriptions carefully to determine which eligibility criteria you meet and which program(s) you can apply for.

How do I know if I am eligible to apply?

Eligibility criteria are listed under each scholarship program in this brochure and in the scholarship descriptions at siliconvalleycf.org/scholarships, along with the complete application instructions. Thoroughly read each scholarship program's eligibility requirements to identify the scholarships for which you may be eligible.

What if I'm attending a community college or vocational school?

Our donors understand that not all students take the traditional path in their pursuit of higher education, and some programs, such as Curry Award for Girls and Young Women, The Harold Johnson Law Enforcement Scholarship, The Marie A. Calderilla Scholarship and The Ruppert Educational Grant Program provides scholarship support to students who attend community college. The Ruppert Educational Grant Program and The Peninsula Regent Charitable Foundation Education Grant Program provide support for students who attend vocational schools. Again, thoroughly review the program descriptions to identify all the scholarships for which you may be eligible.

May I apply for and receive more than one scholarship?

Yes (unless otherwise noted in the scholarship descriptions in this brochure), provided you meet the eligibility criteria for each scholarship for which you apply.

If I win a scholarship, how and when is the money disbursed?

SVCF's policies require scholarship checks to be sent directly to the educational institution in which you will enroll. Checks are issued to your school once we receive your Scholarship Acceptance and Agreement Form and proof of enrollment. Checks are generally issued beginning in July of the awarding year.

Bobette Bibo Gugliotta Memorial Scholarship for Creative Writing

\$1,000 / Up to two one-time awards

For students majoring in the creative writing field and who have demonstrated creative writing ability

Eligibility Requirements

- Demonstrated passion for creative writing (two writing samples are required with student's application)
- Current graduating senior or graduate of a public or private high school in San Mateo County or Santa Clara County
- · Planning to enroll or currently enrolled in a four-year college or university as a full-time student
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include United States legal residents and A.B. 540 students)

Crain Educational Grants Program

Up to \$5,000 / Up to 10 one-time awards

Finalists must interview with the selection committee.

Previous applicants and recipients may reapply.

For students showing academic excellence, extracurricular activities and a commitment to the community

- Demonstrated community involvement over a period of several years
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- · Current graduating senior, or graduate of a public or private high school in San Mateo County or Santa Clara County
- Planning to enroll or enrolled in a four-year college or university as a full-time student
- · United States citizen

Curry Award for Girls and Young Women

\$1,000 / Up to 10 one-time awards

For young women who have undergone unusual hardships to remain in school

Eligibility Requirements

- · Woman age 18-26
- Maximum cumulative grade point average of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- Current resident of San Mateo County, preference given to residents of East Palo Alto, East Menlo Park, Redwood City and San Mateo
- Current graduating high school senior, graduate or G.E.D. certificate holder; preference given to students who attend(ed) East Palo Alto Academy, East Side College Prep, Menlo Atherton, Sequoia, Carlmont and San Mateo high schools
- · Planning to enroll or currently enrolled in a two- or four-year college or university as a full-time student
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include United States legal residents and A.B. 540 students)

Dr. James L. Hutchinson and Evelyn Ribbs Hutchinson Medical School Scholarship

Up to \$2,000 / One award per year

Previous applicants may reapply.

For students who are enrolled or planning to enroll in medical school

- · College senior and accepted to medical school or currently enrolled full-time in an accredited medical school program
- · Demonstrated personal motivation for excellence in both character and academic achievement
- Personal integrity, as exemplified by leadership, community involvement and concern for others, will be considered
- Graduate of a high school in San Mateo County or Santa Clara County or have permanently resided in that area during high school
- · United States citizen



Eustace-Kwan Family Foundation Scholarship

Up to \$10,000 / Up to 10 one-time awards

Finalists must interview with the selection committee.

Previous applicants and recipients may reapply.

For students who are focused, able to articulate clear goals and determined to succeed in their chosen field of study and career

Eligibility Requirements

General criteria:

- Plan to enroll as a full-time student in a four-year college or university for the 2016-17 academic year
- Demonstrated school and/or extra-curricular activities (volunteer or paid)
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include United States legal residents and A.B. 540 students)

Specific criteria for graduating high school seniors:

- · Graduating senior who resides in Redwood City, San Carlos, Belmont, East Palo Alto or Menlo Park
- Cumulative grade point average of 3.0-3.7 on a 4.0 scale

Specific criteria for college students:

- Previous Eustace-Kwan Family Foundation Scholarship recipient pursuing first undergraduate degree or current community college student ready to transfer to a four-year college or university in fall of the upcoming academic school year or current four-year college student
- · Must have permanently resided in Redwood City, San Carlos, Belmont, East Palo Alto or Menlo Park during high school
- A cumulative grade point average between 2.5 and 3.60

Juniper Networks Engineering Scholarship

Up to \$5,000 / Up to 10 one-time awards

For graduating high school seniors with demonstrated success in science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) education courses who are planning to major in engineering

Eligibility Requirements

Hazel Reed Baumeister Scholarship Program

Up to \$5,000 / Up to 15 one-time awards

Previous applicants and recipients may reapply.

For students showing academic excellence, extracurricular activities and a commitment to the community

- Demonstrated community involvement over a period of several years
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 3.5 on a 4.0 scale
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- Graduating high school senior or graduate of a public or private high school in San Mateo County or Santa Clara County
- · Planning to enroll or currently enrolled in a four-year college or university as a full-time student
- United States citizen

Huang Leadership Development Scholarship

Up to \$34,000 (paid over four years, provided renewal eligibility requirements are met) / Up to 10 one-time and renewable awards

Finalists must interview with the selection committee.

Previous applicants and recipients may reapply.

For current SYNNEX employees, past-employees who left the company in good standing, and their dependents or grandchildren, who plan to attend a U.S. or foreign college/university ranked highly by U.S. News and World Reports

- Current employee or past employee, or a legal dependent or grandchild of a current or past employee of SYNNEX Corporation, or its subsidiaries who left the company in good standing
- Current employee or past employee, or a legal dependent or grandchild of a current or past employee that worked for SYNNEX Corporation or its subsidiaries for a minimum of three years as of the application deadline
- Demonstrated leadership qualities through activities in school, community or social service activities
- Planning to attend, have been accepted into or be enrolled on a full-time basis in an undergraduate program in a fouryear college or university ranked as a top college or university or at Chengdu University in China for the upcoming academic year

- Award recipients must be willing to share their experience with their peers and future applicants





Latinos in Technology Scholarship

Up to \$30,000 (paid over three years, provided renewal eligibility requirements are met) / Up to 100 one-time and renewable awards

For Latino(a) students who have a declared major in a science, technology, engineering and math (STEM)-related field

- Of Latino or Hispanic origin (as defined by U.S. Census Bureau)
- Declared major in and been accepted into a science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) program
- Current college student entering their junior or senior year and planning to enroll on a full-time or part-time basis for the next academic school year
 - Preference will be given to full-time and rising junior students
 - Must be a graduate of a high school in the Greater Silicon Valley area (includes Santa Clara County, San Mateo County, San Francisco County; Fremont, Newark, and Union City in Alameda County and Scotts Valley in Santa Cruz County)
 - Preference will be given to San Mateo and Santa Clara County high school graduates
- Minimum cumulative college grade point average of 2.5
- · Demonstrated financial need
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include United States legal residents and students who have obtained Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals)

Odette Moren Scholarship

Up to \$10,000 / Up to eight one-time awards

Finalists must interview with the selection committee.

Previous applicants and recipients may reapply.

For residents of East Palo Alto who show academic excellence and demonstrated financial hardship

Eligibility Requirements

- Current resident of East Palo Alto or permanently resided in East Palo Alto while attending high school
- Minimum cumulative grade point average:
 - 3.0 on a 4.0 scale, if a current graduating high school senior
 - 2.5, if a current college student
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- · Planning to enroll or currently enrolled in a four-year college or university as a full-time student
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include United States legal residents and A.B. 540 students)

Ralph Hale and Martha L. Ruppert Educational Scholarship

Up to \$10,000 / Up to 30 one-time awards

Previous applicants and recipients may reapply.

For "late-bloomers" with academic promise who have not yet reached their potential

Eligibility Requirements

- "Late bloomer" who demonstrates academic promise and continuous grade point average improvement during high school or college
- Demonstrated community involvement
- Maximum cumulative grade point average of 3.3 on a 4.0 scale
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- Current graduating senior or graduate of a public or private high school in San Mateo County, San Francisco County or Santa Clara County
- Planning to enroll or enrolled in two- or four-year college, university or vocational school as a full-time student
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include United States legal residents and A.B. 540 students)

Sand Hill Scholars Program

Up to \$12,000 (paid over four years, provided renewal eligibility requirements are met) / Up to two renewable awards

Finalists must interview with the selection committee.

For graduating high school seniors who are willing to participate actively in workshop and mentoring activities throughout their undergraduate careers

- Current graduating senior attending a high school in San Mateo County
- Cumulative grade point average between 3.0-3.8 on a 4.0 scale
- Planning to enroll in a four-year college or university as a full-time student
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include United States legal residents and A.B. 540 students)



The Abby Sobrato Scholarship

Up to \$20,000 (paid over four years, provided renewal eligibility requirements are met) / Up to 20 one-time and renewable awards

For graduating high school seniors and graduates of Latino College Preparatory Academy in San José, California, who plan to pursue postsecondary education

Eligibility Requirements

- Graduating high school senior or graduate of the Latino College Prep Academy in San José, California
- Planning to enroll in a two- or four-year college or vocational school as a full-time student
 - Preference will be given to students enrolling in a four-year college
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include legal residents and A.B. 540 students)

The Bright Futures Scholarship

Up to \$10,000 / Up to 20 one-time awards

By invitation, for eligible students who applied to a SVCF Managed Scholarship, and can demonstrate academic excellence and unmet need

- Applied for, but not awarded, a community foundation managed scholarship and/or was awarded a scholarship, but can demonstrate unmet need after all other forms of college financial aid are secured
- Demonstrated academic promise with a cumulative grade point average between 3.3-3.8 on a 4.0 scale
- · Currently enrolled at a four-year educational institution as a full-time student

The Harold Johnson Law Enforcement Scholarship

Up to \$5,000 / Up to seven one-time awards

Finalists must interview with the selection committee.

Previous applicants and recipients may reapply.

For students who plan to pursue a career in police work, corrections or other criminal justice fields

Eligibility Requirements

- · A demonstrated desire and a plan to pursue a career in police work, corrections or other criminal justice fields
 - Law school students are not eligible
- Minimum cumulative grade point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale
- Current graduating senior or graduate of a public or private high school in the greater San Francisco Bay Area (includes San Francisco, San Mateo, Marin, Alameda, Contra Costa, Santa Clara, Napa, Solano, Sonoma, Santa Cruz, Monterey and San Benito Counties)
- · Planning to enroll or currently enrolled in a two- or four-year college, university or police academy as a full-time student
- · United States citizen

The Marie A. Calderilla Scholarship

Up to \$20,000 (paid over three or four years, provided renewal eligibility requirements are met) / Up to 20 one-time and renewable awards

Finalists must interview with the selection committee.

Previous applicants and recipients may reapply.

For female students planning to attend a college within the San Mateo County Community College District (Cañada College, College of San Mateo and Skyline Community College)

Eligibility Requirements

- Female student, pursuing first undergraduate degree or certificate program
- Graduating high school senior or re-entry student planning to attend a college in the San Mateo County Community College District (Cañada College, San Mateo Community College and Skyline Community College)
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- · Serious about improving her life through education
- United States citizen or eligible non-citizen (eligible non-citizens include United States legal residents and A.B. 540 students)

The Peninsula Regent Charitable Foundation Educational Grant Program

Up to \$10,000 / Up to 15 one-time awards

Previous applicants and recipients my reapply.

For Peninsula Regent Employees and/or their dependents who plan to attend an accredited two- or four-year college, university or vocational school

- Current employee of the Peninsula Regent for at least 90 days as of the application deadline or dependent of an employee who has worked at the Peninsula Regent for at least 90 days as of the application deadline
- Preference will be given to applicants with strong educational motivation, perseverance and involvement outside the classroom, and personal characteristics such as honesty and good judgment
- The selection committee will also strongly consider applicants who have dropped out of school for reasons beyond their control or have undergone unusual hardships to remain in school
- · Demonstrated financial hardship
- · United States citizen or legal resident

Donor Involved Scholarships

Donor Involved Scholarships are administered by SVCF in partnership with schools, nonprofits, organizations or individuals wishing to support higher education. While SVCF provides oversight and administers the payment process, the application and selection processes for Donor Involved Scholarships are managed by an external selection committee appointed by SVCF.
