


The general focus of high school is education, but it is not solely education. We know that students that are more engaged outside the classroom with school activities are more likely to do better in the classroom.

The typical freshman schedule consists of six class. The first five are scripted for most students with slight variations depending on students' test scores and interests. Many students choose a foreign language as their elective, to begin the college A-G foreign language requirement. Only select electives (noted with an asterisk) are permitted as an additional seventh course.

**English. Math & Science** 

Students are placed according to their test results. There may be some choices to select advanced placement options.

Placement options for English, math and science are dependent on the high school test assessment scores that students took in December or January. If you are coming from out of district, then those tests will be administered when you come to the office to register.

There are two tests (Math and reading).

- MDTP (math)
- GMRT (reading)

At Woodside, we use multiple measures to place students to include tests scores, teacher recommendations (only recommending up), and student and family feedback.

## **Physical Education**

Three seasons of Athletics or two seasons of Dance/Cheer can meet the PE requirement starting in 10<sup>th</sup> grade year.

PE is required for all students in the freshman year, regardless if your student intends on playing high school sports. There are options for Woodside sports for PE credit starting in the sophomore year.

## **World Language**

(A student can come in at any level depending on experience and ability.)

World Language is not a graduation requirement but an elective. For college acceptance, different than graduation, it is required. Two years of the same language is the minimum requirement. For most students world language should be your freshman elective unless your student is pursuing a known passion like art, music, theatre, etc.
